Learning facilities at SeniorNet include:-

Workshops – 2 hour sessions - charge of \$5 for each workshop

Regular two hour workshops are held on a wide range of subjects of current interest. They cater for up to 25 people and are led by members with specialised experience, or by invited facilitators. Past topics have included iPads/tablets; TradeMe; Skype; Google tools; internet banking; eBooks; Windows 10; how to avoid computer viruses; travel planning on the internet; storing files. Short Courses - charges \$10 per 2 hour session

These enable members, in small groups, to attend hands-on practical sessions with up to one-to-one help. They may be refreshers or cover some issues in more detail. Generally they are for a 2 hour session on one day. Some courses may extend to two days. Topics held include a refresher on basic skills, understanding files and folders, Gmail, editing images, tracking finances and even more. On occasions matters raised as topics of interest by members from other workshops or tutorials could be the subject of a short course.

Monthly Tutorials - free to members.

These sessions provide members the opportunity to share experiences as well as hear from guest presenters. They meet monthly as follows:-

Questions & Answers (Q&A) is an opportunity for members to ask any questions and to listen to other questions and answers. It is a great learning opportunity. No question is too silly.

Advanced Technical Issues (COG) for those members who want to know more detail about the technical issues surrounding equipment and software applications. It's also an opportunity to learn and share new technology.

Digicam enables members to discuss a wide range of digital photography matters including the opportunity to ask questions and learn about new cameras and software developments.

Writing & Publishing (W&P) offers members the opportunity to share writing experiences, display and talk about successful writing projects, discuss difficulties encountered and how to solve them. Guest speakers also attend on occasions.

Apple Mac and Android User Groups offer members the opportunity to share experiences, ask questions, learn about recent developments and listen to guest speakers

Clinics for Individual Help - charge of \$10

Held on Mondays from 12.30 – 2.30pm (not on public holidays) the clinics help members with laptops and portable devices to solve problems. Members are invited to attend the Learning Centre at Anvil House to receive one-to-one help from tutors regarding problems.

Supervised Practice Sessions - \$5 per hour

An official practice session, with a tutor present, is held every Monday from 12 Noon to 2.30pm (except public holidays)

Details of these including date, subject and notes about each session are emailed to members near the date. These are free to members. Registration is not necessary.

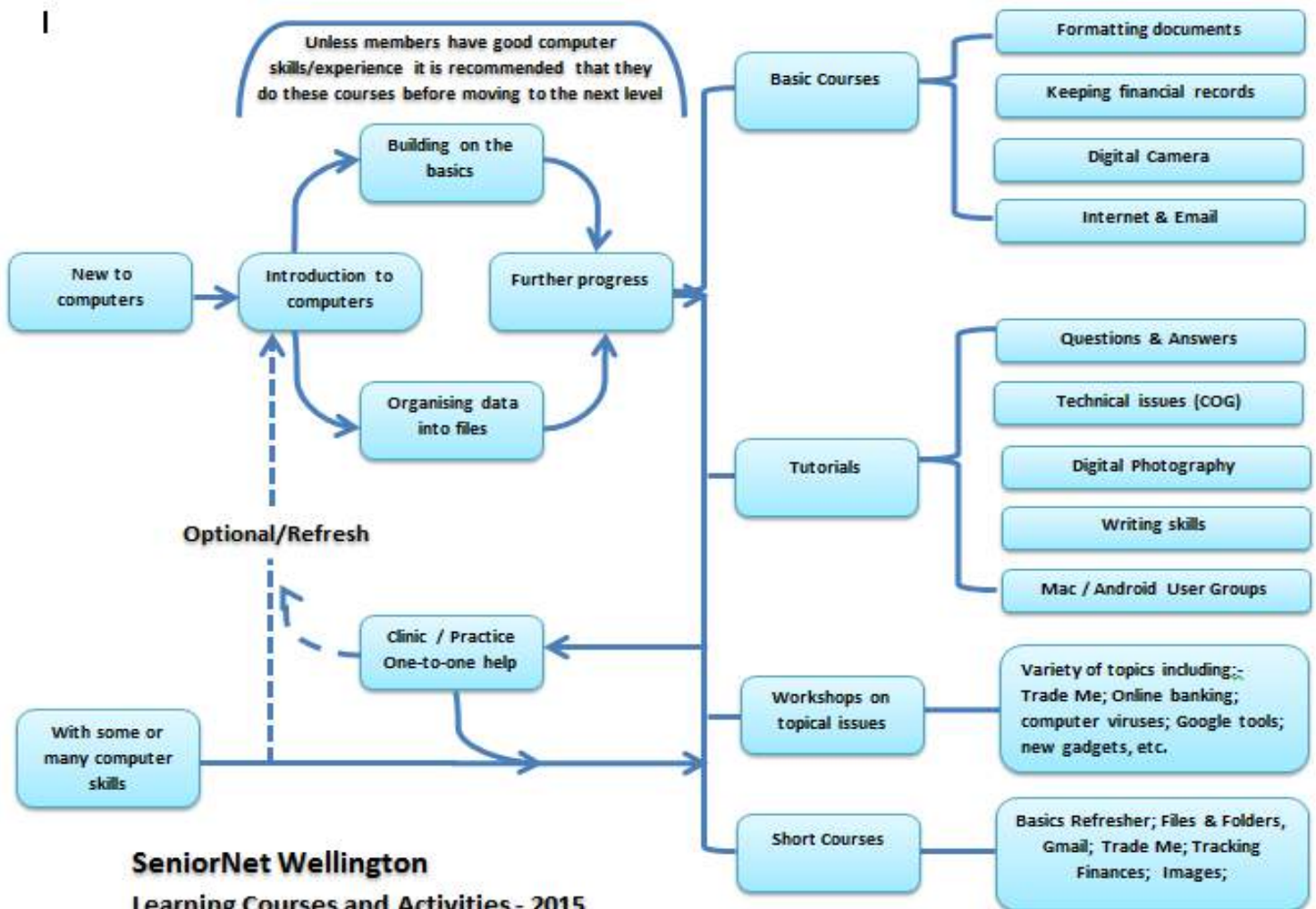
Short Courses
